Need to Know - Deep interest in metrics and how to use them to inform goals

Career Connect WA - Year 1 Outcomes | Vickei | (Section Slides)

- Aiming for 10 new Career Launch applications in development, which will create 440 Launch Spots (10% of the 9-year goal)
- Vickei will update and provide a breakdown of business engagement experiences at the October meeting
- Current student data reflects all grade levels, does not provide a 5th-grade-only breakdown
- Statewide data does not include how the data was gathered
- Diversity data only related to Career Launch
 - CL may be too new to reflect equity given the smaller pool of applicants (pulled from students in HS CTE courses, incumbent workers employed in an organization that might want to advance, and intermediary work with disconnected workers)
- <u>Vickei will pull cenrollment rates from the CCW Progress Report and send to Governance Board members (see end of minutes)</u>

Discussion | Vickei | (Section Slides)

- What Data and impacts will best show you that we are making progress towards our regional and statewide goals?
 - Student attainment statistics achievement gap, underrepresented groups what are the data points showing progress for those students groups and/or credentialing?
 - Interested in the end-game, the hoped for end results (Post-secondary | Graduation rate | Dual Credit | Put into Workforce)
 - Breakdown into equity, and what areas the numbers are coming from.

- o How are we telling our regional story?
 - This year business engagement, how they are engaging, and what the student outcomes are.
 - Should get more follow-up on students placed in the Career Launch spots
 - Overcoming challenges of a rural area; expanding options when they are spread out and don't have the same resources as the I-5 corridor

• Input on <u>2020-21 Goals</u>

- Timeframes should be shortened to 6 months (short), 1 year (mid), 2 years (long) with incremental goals, with current long-term as end goals. Legislative changes can have impacts on goals that are too far out
- o Thinking on system alignment think on what do we have that we can draw from to support the organization, while also working on our own individual pieces.
 - System reports need to be relevant to the impacts we are seeing in the world. If the
 goals of the network don't help the dislocated workers and students coming out of
 school it is irrelevant.
- Suggest for each goal to have top-three priorities which all can align
- Governors State of Innovation Workplan
 - CCW (state-level) would put on a virtual challenge for students to showcase solutions to Washington business/industry problems.
- Vickei will send out year-end report for feedback

Overall, the state hit the enrollment goal, exceeding Year 1 target of 8,400 by 19% and, despite the pandemic hit 83% of program creation goal.
