COURSE	DESCRIPTION	
Teaching Academy	The class explores learning styles, teaching methods and classroom management strategies. The course generally offers class time assisting educators.	
Child Development	Students have the opportunity to gain knowledge and understanding of child development through a combination of classroom curriculum and practicum experience in the classroom.	
Preschool Internship	Designed to provide second year Child Development students an opportunity for active participation with preschool children. Students select, prepare, present and evaluate a variety of learning activities that are age and developmentally appropriate for preschool children.	
Careers in Education	Offers a unique experience for students who are interested in working with young people, particularly in the fields of teaching, early childhood education, educational paraprofessionals, child care, counseling, child psychology, pediatrics and social and human service occupations.	
Child Psychology	Child psychology is a broad area, covering how people change as they grow up from birth through to adolescence.
